

INTRO

Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.

Psalm 51:10 (ESV)

Work out your own salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who works in you.

Philippians 2:12b-13a

Psalm 51 is a calling for renewal. Years ago, as I read this passage, I was struck by two words in verse 10—**create** and **renew**. These two words seem to be at the heart of growth. After a season of drift, lethargy, and no direction, we need God to create something new in us and renew something once established in us. That is the heart of Renewal.

2020 was traumatic for all of us as individuals and as a people. Understandably, we have been doing our best to survive, maintain, and get through a unique and challenging season. This has left us with the need to rediscover the joy of following Jesus. As we seek Him first, God creates something new in His relationship with us while renewing our foundation in Christ. Growth in Him changes us, and does not let us return to life as before.

GOD IS ALREADY WORKING ON US

Experiencing Renewal in our relationship with God requires resolve from each of us.

Philippians 2:12-13 says

Work out your own salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure.” The power of this passage is our partnership with God in His work in our inner life. God invites us to join Him in the work He is already doing in our hearts, minds, and actions.

Romans 8:28-29 teaches us that God has a plan to have Christ formed in us. Think about that truth: Jesus is working to make you a better version of yourself. Our destiny is to become like Jesus.

NOT JUST TRYING HARDER AND DOING MORE

Let's be clear. Renewal is not a pep talk from the self-help world that tells us to “try harder.” Instead, God invites us into a deeper relationship with Him. For this time of Renewal, we will walk together with the Spirit to know and become like Jesus, no matter where we are on our journey.

IT IS ABOUT A JOURNEY

Wherever we are on our journey, we will take steps together to know and become like Jesus. This is the vision statement of Jacob's Well and remains our core focus, as it has from the start of the church. At Jacob's Well, we often ask two important questions that are central to following Jesus. They will be central as we dive deeper with God in this time of Renewal:

THE JOURNEY TOOL

For many of us, the greatest adventure we will experience during Renewal is to gain a deeper understanding of the process of transformation. Deep life change is always discovered as a journey. As a church we are going to rediscover our Journey Tool. This tool is designed to help us slow down and answer the two central questions:

Where am I on my spiritual journey? | What is my next step?

THE JOURNEY



Over the next eight weeks we are going to grow in our understanding of what the pilgrimage of growth looks like in a believer's life. We will understand how to grow. Remember, this is not about you trying harder. This is about you joining God who is at work in your life to deepen you to know and become like Jesus. This is not about you doing more. In fact, for some of you this season may be a call for you to do less. This is not for us all to make the same changes, but it is a personal journey in which the Spirit speaks into your life about the changes He wants to grow in your life. This is not a journey you will take alone, but a journey that is best taken with others, because deep life change happens best in community.

HOW TO
SPEND TIME WITH
GOD

INTRO

At Jacob's Well, we believe it is essential for each person to spend daily time with God individually and to be in a consistent community with other believers (a small group, for example) for discussion, learning, and group prayer. Why do we believe that having an intentional, consistent time with God and others is so important? We believe that "Wherever we are on our journey, we need to take steps together to know and become like Jesus." To more fully know Jesus, we must deepen and strengthen our relationship with Him and with one another. To become like Him, we must know Him in a relationship and then let that relationship change our individual lives and our lives with one another.

We are all different. Each of us will have a unique relationship with God. For this reason, it is important to understand that there is not one specific devotional pathway that will be a perfect fit for each person. Learn more about this here, by taking a Spiritual Temperament Quiz: <https://www.focusonthefamily.com/marriage/your-spiritual-temperament-quiz/>. Take time to discover your best way of connecting with God. Determine what rhythm to create in your life to study God's Word. Pick out a location and time of day that helps you feel most connected with Him, and let this time of Renewal move you forward in your relationship with Him and with others in fellowship.

SOME SUGGESTIONS FOR YOUR PERSONAL QUIET TIME:

- Establish a time of day and a specific place to begin.
- As you sit with God, start by becoming quiet. You can do this through a few deep breaths. Make sure your phone is in another room. Turn off the television and do your best to remove distractions.
- Sometimes it helps to have a pad of paper. If distractions come, write them down so that you can work through them later. For example, if you remember you need to do something, make yourself a note so that you can let it go during your time with God.
- Start with a prayer asking God to open your heart to Him and His message.
- Jacob's Well provides you with this study guide that will guide you in choosing Scripture passages and will lead you through your quiet time with God.
- As you finish your time, be silent and wait for a while to see how God works in your heart and mind. Don't rush away. You might miss something He is trying to say to you.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to help you see what He might be speaking to you through the Scriptures and the teachings during Renewal.
- End your time in prayer, expressing Praise, Confession, Prayers for others, and Prayers for yourself and your family.

SOME SUGGESTIONS AS YOU PREPARE FOR SMALL GROUP:

- If you do not complete all of your devotions for the week, please continue to participate with your group.
- As you meet each week, begin by discussing the weekend message and then discuss the week's Small Group Study Guide devotions.
- Make sure everyone has a chance to participate.

- Be respectful. Listen to each other and encourage each other. (Remember we are not counselors!) Make prayer a priority.
- Believe God. He desires to deepen our relationship with Him as individuals, group members, and as a church. Renewal is going to be an inspiring time. As God works, take notes and be ready to share your stories because we want God to receive all the glory for what He is about to do in us and through us!
- As in your personal quiet time, end your time in prayer, expressing Praise, Confession, Prayers for others, and Prayers for yourself and your family.

SCRIPTURE MEMORY

WEEK 1

1 Corinthians 9:24-27 (ESV)

Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one receives the prize? So, run that you may obtain it. Every athlete exercises self-control in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we are imperishable. So, I do not run aimlessly; I do not box as one beating the air. But I discipline my body and keep it under control, lest after preaching to others I myself should be disqualified.

WEEK 2

John 4:13-14

Jesus said to her, 'Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again. The water that I will give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life.'

WEEK 3

Matthew 7:7-11

Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened. Or which one of you, if his son asks him for bread, will give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a serpent? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him!

WEEK 4

John 17:3

And this is eternal life, that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent.

WEEK 5

Philippians 2:12-13

Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, so now, not only as in my presence but much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure.

WEEK 6

Philippians 3:13-14

Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

WEEK 7

Hebrews 10:24

And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and do good works.

SPECIAL NOTE FOR GROUP LEADERS FROM PASTOR PAUL

Dear Group Leaders,

Thank you for your leadership at Jacob's Well! What a privilege to partner with you as we come alongside one another, taking steps together in community to know and become like Jesus. In whichever way you meet, build a growing sense of trust and safety within your group through wisdom, humility, and compassion. Be sensitive to individual personalities and needs among your group's participants. Before instructing someone to read aloud, for example, make sure they feel comfortable and willing to do so. The more those in your group know you genuinely care for them and want them to have a good experience, the more their sense of trust and safety will grow, which means they'll be more fully able to experience the depth God has for them as part of your group.

In this study, our discussion questions will use the English Standard Version (ESV).

SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS

INDIVIDUAL AND GROUP QUESTIONS
FOR FEBRUARY 1 - 13
AS WE PREPARE FOR RENEWAL

JACOB'S WELL VISION STATEMENT

Wherever we are on our journey, we will take steps together to know and become like Jesus.

1. As you think about Jacob's Well's vision statement, highlight the most meaningful words to you. Why did you highlight these words?
2. How active are you in your pursuit of Jesus? Would you describe your journey with Him as indifferent, casual, or passive, or would you describe it as active, engaged, central, and a priority? Why?
3. When you experience longing, dissonance, and dissatisfaction in your journey, what do you do? For example, do you ignore it? Do you feel shame? Do you assume it means you are weak and unspiritual? Do you cover it up with unhealthy choices? Maybe you cover up the ache with acts of service? Perhaps you become angry, frustrated, and distant in your relationships? What do you do with your response?

Read Philippians 2:12-13 (ESV)

Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, so now, not only as in my presence but much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling, ¹³for it is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure.

4. What do you think it means that God is at work in you? Does that surprise you? Does that encourage you?
5. What does it mean to, "work out your own salvation?" What if we put it a different way, "work salvation into every part of your life"?

Read Romans 8:28-30

And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose. ²⁹For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn among many brothers. ³⁰And those whom he predestined he also called, and those whom he called he also justified, and those whom he justified he also glorified.

6. This verse says God has a plan for you. What is the priority of His plan?
7. Do you trust God's will for your life? Do you agree with this statement? "When we submit to God's will, we ultimately find out that this is what we wanted all along."

Read Philippians 1:6

And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.

8. Does this verse describe spiritual growth (knowing and becoming like Jesus) as an event, or as a process over time? Which better describes your own experience?
9. Here are two essential questions to dive deeper with God in this time of Renewal. How do you feel about those Questions? As we begin this journey, how would you answer these questions?

Where am I on my spiritual journey? What is my next step?

In these questions, we are reengaging with God because He desires us to grow in our relationship with Him. Our relationship with Him changes us from the inside out when we partner with Him to grow spiritually. Will you commit to participating with your Jacob's Well Church family in Renewal?

PRAYER

Pray for each other, and pray the words of Ephesians 3:14-21 over each other:

Ephesians 3:14-21

¹⁴For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, ¹⁵from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named, ¹⁶that according to the riches of his glory he may grant you to be strengthened with power through his Spirit in your inner being, ¹⁷so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith—that you, being rooted and grounded in love, ¹⁸may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, ¹⁹and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

²⁰Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, ²¹to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen.

WEEK 1 INTRO

Most of us long to vacation, taking a trip somewhere fun to rid us of the hardship of our experience the last 12 months. Typically, we picture a destination to relax, a place to unwind, a time of refreshment and renewal. Removing ourselves from the repetitive nature of life is necessary to revive our weary souls. Maybe you long to get away and have some adventure to change things up and find some excitement for the weariness you feel. Perhaps you feel stuck and want to make a change, but you realize a vacation will only provide limited relief from your experience.

What if you discovered amid life's journey that there is a journey worth taking in every day? In the ordinary of each moment of daily living, there is a journey waiting—a journey we must prepare for, and a compelling quest calling our name. The destination is not a specific place on earth, but rather a call to live eyes wide, ears intently listening, and hearts open to a deeper relationship with the Creator of the Universe. This journey is intentional and may encounter obstacles. However, it is not a journey of escape, but rather, it is a voyage of being in the presence of One who waits for

us to end the distractions of daily pursuits to instead pursue Him. God calls us to embrace a life-long adventure in our relationship with Him. This journey of a relationship with Him slowly moves us from a constant focus on our outer world to an ever-increasing realization of God's extraordinary presence in our inner world through the Holy Spirit. We experience a deeper realization of our identity as a child of God and respond to a kind of forever destiny in Him.


If you realize you have been living for yourself first, and feel stuck and want to make a change, the answer is not in trying harder. This devotional invites you into a place of study in how God is walking us through this world to know Him more in a love relationship through the gift of His Son. In the journey of knowing Him more by putting Him first, we find His unconditional love in Jesus. In finding His unconditional love in Jesus, we find the courage to let Him begin to grow and mature us more and more into His Son's character. Our lives become His. In becoming His, we find whom He created us to be.

This week we are going to take intentional steps to make room for God in our lives. With focus, we can organize our lives to have the breadth to listen and learn from Him. In seeking Him first, He will help us discern where we are on our journey. By the power of His Holy Spirit, we let Him work first to change us and then the environment in which we live. The environment includes all areas of our life.

This time of Renewal begins with an understanding that change in Christ is a process and a journey. He is central to all change. Over the next seven weeks, we will rediscover an active pursuit of God by using the Journey Tool as a new way of thinking about our lives as active and engaged in our relationship with God. He is at work in us. Let's join Him on the journey, and come alongside one another encouraging each other where we are.

The journey moves us toward a glorious future in Christ. We can have hope because of the end we are moving toward in the relationship we have with the Lord. Our immediate place in the journey may not be clear, but we can step confidentially into discovery because we are in God's Hands. God is good. He has good plans in mind, and we can trust Him. He is working to make each of us into the reflection of His Son.



The week’s memory verse is 1 Corinthians 9:24-27.

Write the verse here:

Keep this verse in front of you this week. Write it on a notecard and keep it where you can read and recite it as you go through your day. Maybe place it on your bathroom mirror, your car’s dashboard, or on your refrigerator door. Find the place that best works for you!

God calls us to embrace a life-long adventure in our relationship with Him. In **1 Corinthians 9:24-27**, the Apostle Paul engages an athletic metaphor to describe his life as an Apostle. The Corinthians would have understood Paul’s comparison as Corinth hosted the biennial Isthmian games. Paul encourages his readers to see their pursuit of God as a race meant for each of them to participate with focus and determination. He describes the process of our life-long adventure journeying with God as a race. Can you imagine other metaphorical illustrations of running a race? Perhaps reading a long book from start to finish, completing a project from idea to fulfillment, receiving a degree, taking a noble quest, fighting a battle, climbing a mountain, taking a canoe down a river, driving across the desert, participating in a treasure hunt, a ropes course, a swim meet, sailing across the ocean or taking a trip across the country? Other ideas?

The winner of the race in Corinth won a perishable wreath as a crown. Only one winner won the prize in the games, but Paul urges the Corinthians to see that their journey to pursue God in love is a journey toward an eternal reward for everyone who runs.

Taking steps to know and become like Jesus does not happen without intentionality. We must participate with focus and determination because Christ is central to all change.

Taking steps to know and become like Jesus, however, does not mean a hectic life. The prize is not external works of service. The pursuit of knowing and becoming like Jesus offers a deep relationship with God first and foremost. He is the prize now and for eternity. The transformation of our life results from seeking God first and living to know Him more. We learn to believe Him and believe He is at work in us. This is how we learn to love Him with all our heart, soul, and mind. (**Matthew 22:37, Mark 12:30, and Luke 10:27**)

If someone came alongside to examine your life, what crown might they say you are running to win? Why?

“Heavenly Father, during this time of Renewal, please give me the courage to wholeheartedly follow Jesus. **Matthew 6:19-20** says, “Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal.

God, help me to avoid accumulating treasures on earth. Help me invest in the eternal. In the process, as I run, remind me that the prize I am running for now and for eternity is imperishable.”

Try listening to God’s Word. Perhaps record **1 Corinthians 9:24-27** on your phone so that you can listen to it as you drive, take a walk, wash dishes or work around your house or yard. You can also go to www.biblegateway.com and listen to the verse through the website. Play the verses through several times as you memorize the passage this week. (We have been using the English Standard Version or ESV in this study guide.)

The journey of a relationship with God slowly moves us from a constant focus on our outer world to an ever-increasing realization of God’s extraordinary presence in our inner world. Before we determine where we are on our journey, it helps to evaluate our priorities in life. It is easy to believe we are running our race with purpose, as **1 Corinthians 9:24-27** teaches, but the reality of our life may not match our perception. Mark out the race you are running by measuring how you spend your time. Estimate the time you spend on daily activities in the chart below.

Consider adding a spiritual discipline or giving up something for God during the season of Lent (which begins Wednesday, February 17) to create more space and time for Him. It takes intentionality to discover God and His principles in a more profound way. Pray and ask God for His wisdom, guidance, and direction. Ask Him to give you focus and determination in your decision.

“*Father, I abandon myself into your hands; do with me what you will. Whatever you may do, I thank you; I am ready for all, I accept all. Let only your will be done in me, and all your creatures. I wish no more than this, O Lord. Into your hands I commend my soul; I offer it to you with all the love of my heart, for I love you, Lord, and so I need to give myself, to surrender myself into your hands, without reserve, and with boundless confidence. For you are my Father.*”

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 17, 2021

Try reciting **1 Corinthians 9:24-27** out loud to see if you have any of the passage set in your memory. Continue to work on reciting the verses as you drive, take a walk, wash dishes or work around your house or yard.

If you realize you have been living for yourself first, and if you feel stuck and want to make a change, the answer is not in trying harder. This devotional invites you into a place of learning to try softer, try different, and try together as we study how God is walking us through this world to know Him more in a love relationship. This love relationship begins with salvation.

Jesus knew His purpose on earth. He spent His time honoring His Father, and He went to the cross on our behalf.

Read John 12:27.

Lent, which begins today, is a time to reflect on Jesus’ suffering and death. It is also a time to recognize our faith in Jesus is a response to God.

As we begin the season of Lent, first ask, “Have I truly submitted my life to Jesus as Lord?”

God calls us to believe in Jesus, His life, death, burial, and resurrection. God accepts us not because of what we do, but because we humble ourselves before Him and receive the gift of salvation given in His Son.

If you realize today that you have not received the gift of salvation in Jesus, read **Romans 3:21-26**. All of us sin and fall short of the glory of God. Each of us needs God’s grace in Jesus because we are trapped in sin and need a Savior. We are rescued by God’s grace because He sent His Son Jesus to take the penalty of our sin by dying on the cross. When we recognize this truth, confess our sin, and ask Jesus to be Lord of our life, His Holy Spirit takes residence inside us, and we are given eternity with God. **Romans 10: 9-10** says, “because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart, one believes and is justified, and with the mouth, one confesses and is saved.”

If you realize you need to ask Jesus into your life, pray to Him now using **Romans 10:9-10** as your guide. Let one of the church staff members know of your decision so that the church can celebrate with you!

If the decision to ask Jesus into your life is a decision previously made, complacency can settle in over time. This booklet is a tool to get back on track to run the race with purpose.

Remember, our own efforts, however sincere, cannot save us. As long as we think, even subconsciously, that it was possible to contribute to our salvation, we will not put God in the place we should. We will not worship Him with the humility, dependence, and thanksgiving He deserves.

Contemplate where you are on your journey with God in His gift of salvation in Jesus.

Pray **Psalm 13:5**: “But I have trusted in your steadfast love; my heart shall rejoice in your salvation.”

May those who love Your salvation say evermore,
'God is great!'*”

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 18, 2021

Write out **1 Corinthians 9:24-27** by memory as best you can. Keep working! You are doing great!

Read Romans 6:11-13 and Galatians 5:17

In finding God’s unconditional love in the gift of salvation, we are called to grow--to find the courage to let Him begin to mature us more into the character of Christ. Trust in God is an essential component of spiritual growth.

Who and what do you trust for growth? Do you trust your best thought, an expert, or popular culture?

In **1 Corinthians 9:24-27**, Paul talks about the importance of discipline. Discipline gives us the focus to run the race with purpose. More importantly, disciplining ourselves to read Scripture, pray, and participate in worship is how God communicates His grace to us. Long-lasting change comes by understanding His grace and learning to trust Him with every part of our lives.

1 Timothy 4:7a-8 says, “Rather train yourself for godliness; for while bodily training is of some value, godliness is of value in every way, as it holds promise for the present life and also for the life to come.”

Is Jesus integrated into every part of your life, or are there parts of your life you have not handed over to Him? Why?

Jesus is our companion walking with us on the journey. We have to trust Him as our guide. He loves us. He knows what is going on inside of us. When we realize we are walking with Him, we begin to let go of the burden of figuring everything out on our own. God knows the right pace and our best next step in the journey. God is not meant to be the place we turn only when things are hard. God is our life, and this is what it means to be a follower of Jesus Christ.

Is God part of your life, or is He your life?

Eternal life is lived in relationship with God now and for eternity. Renewal is an intentional way to guide us back to living in a known relationship with God. God desires our whole life. We are to give it all to Him in love, and this is what it means to be in a relationship with Him.

The Journey Tool we will be learning during Renewal is a tool to connect with God to know Him first and learn to trust Him. If you realize you lack trust in God, that is okay. Over the next six weeks, your confidence in Him will grow. Allowing Him to work in us to trust Him is hard at first, but if we recognize He is at work in us, we have a new perspective on our relationship with Him. The more we learn how His love and grace are at work in our inner being, the more we learn to trust Him. The more we trust He is at work in us, the more we find peace and contentment in the process of His work to change us to be more and more like His Son.

Jesus liberates us from ignoring our sin or putting confidence in ourselves for righteousness. Christian obedience is the reflection of the Spirit’s work in transforming our minds and hearts. Obedience is not automatic. Faithfulness to God does not come by ignoring Him or our sin, and it does not come by trying harder to please Him. Trust comes by understanding His dedication to us as His children, which comes by placing ourselves in His Presence day in and day out, learning He is at work in us as we seek Him. This time of Renewal is for this purpose.

Meditate on **Psalm 119:9-16**. Pray the words of the Psalm as your own.

FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 19, 2021

Challenge yourself to recite **1 Corinthians 9:24-27** by memory as best you can.

Read Luke 6:31-35

We have the Holy Spirit at work in us, but we must participate by listening and following His direction. We must battle against the enemy and sin’s continuing influence in our life. Renewal will be a gift to help get back on course, running the race with purpose and fighting the battle of faith.

The battle of faith needs our attention, but many of the arguments we engage in keep us off track. Do you feel like you have been fighting? Do you know why you are fighting?

Sometimes we fight because we are afraid. How did the past year create fear in you?

This last twelve months put all of us under a tremendous amount of pressure. Looking back, did fear cause you to embrace an attitude that you realize now made you fight battles that were not important?

Remember, righteous anger is not born out of fear. If you are angry, do you know why are you angry?

God calls us to fight the battle of faith. Futile fights with one another do not draw us closer to God in love. These useless fights also do not attract others to follow Jesus.

In running the race with purpose, our internal motivation is God’s central concern. We seek God first. As we engage in discussion with others, we remain calm and speak the truth in love. If the conversation begins to escalate, it is best to pray and trust God rather than insisting on being right.

Over the next six weeks, our focus will be on the internal work God desires to do in us as individuals. We focus on His work in us, but His work in us also shows us how to love one another. As you look back over 2020, did you engage in a heated discussion with others over the pandemic, politics, the election, racial, and social injustices?

Do you realize you acted in a way that did not shine the light of Christ?

As we get started on the journey, is there anyone you need to offer an apology? Maybe someone treated you with disrespect, and you are holding a grudge. Who might you need to forgive? Spend time in prayer. The next six weeks will need our full attention as we wholeheartedly seek God to know Him more, learn His love, and grow in His character.

“Glory to God in the highest, and peace to His people on earth. Lord God heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world; have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father; receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.”

Read Romans 6:21-22

Here are two crucial questions to dive deeper with God during this time of Renewal:

Where am I on my spiritual journey? What is my next step?

We are reengaging with God in these questions. Each week for the next six weeks as part of Renewal, we will dive deeply into six themes that make the journey process life-changing in our relationship with Christ: thirst, search, know, experience, depth, and community. Renewal aims to remind us that worship is the way we live. Every part of our life is a place to give to God in worship. The journey requires discipline. Over the next few weeks, we will learn a tool to help us stay on course. We will spend our entire lives growing closer to God, and the Journey Tool is a tool we can return to over and over again in our spiritual walk. In this process we find hope to believe in God for change and to believe He is working in our life.

This week has helped prepare us to reengage in the journey of transformation. The journey draws us closer to God, and eventually will lead us into eternal life with Him. When we stand before Him, our desire at that moment will be to tell Him we ran our race to know Him more, to receive His love, to live His grace, and to share Him with others. We do not need to beat ourselves up for how we have lived, but instead turn our focus to Him for the future. This study is an opportunity to move forward.

Prayer is a guide: Pray that any misperceptions you have of God are renewed with His truth. Pray for help in avoiding idleness in your pursuit of Him. Pray that God’s faithfulness leads you to a deeper and more profound dedication in your devotion to Him. Have you decided to let go of something to discover God and His principles more deeply? How are you creating more space and time for God in your life? How are you offering Him the priority in your life?

During Renewal, seek God to know Him more in a relationship. Seek Him for wisdom on how He is at work in your inner life. What might He be at work to help you see in this season? How might He be at work to plant seeds to grow the Fruit of His Holy Spirit (love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control) in your relationships, health, finances, work, or school?

If you are married or are a parent, how may He be at work in your marriage or parenting? Would you like Him to help you communicate more clearly with those you love? If the time spent in prayer and reflection each day would mean growth in your relationship with God, which in turn would grow your other relationships, would you be willing to try? Real, authentic, two-way communication starts as we yield our will to God’s.

“Lord, I pray that You would teach me to yield myself to Your Spirit, Holy Spirit, teach me to trust You as a living person who leads my life and my prayers. Help me to understand your ministry and power. Help me to understand You as my Comforter, Counselor, Helper, Advocate, Intercessor, and Strengthener. I long to see a demonstration of Your power in my life just as the Apostle Paul did (**1 Corinthians 2:2-5**). I thank You that You indwell, seal, sanctify, and empower me. You guide me, teach me, and pray through me. Help me to partner with You in everything I do. Transform my life completely with Your power. Make me sensitive to Your promptings, and teach me to partner with You in prayer in a deeper way.”



READ ALOUD TOGETHER

Psalm 63:1

O God, you are my God; earnestly I seek you; my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where there is no water.

DISCUSS

1. Can you remember a time when you were very physically thirsty? How is that like having a spiritual or emotional thirst? Have you ever had a deep spiritual thirst? Have you ever felt like the psalmist in **Psalm 63:1**?

2. What are some other words for thirst? Longing, discontent, dissatisfied, troubled. What other words come to mind?

3. Often, Christians believe that it is a sign of weakness to have spiritual thirst. But what if thirst is an indication that something is missing. Do you agree with the following statement?

Thirst is not an indication that we have done something wrong but that the Holy Spirit is stirring something in us to bring a positive change.

4. Do you believe spiritual thirst is evidence that the Holy Spirit is calling us to a deeper place in our relationship with the Lord? Why or why not?

5. Read **John 4:1-15**. In this story, how does Jesus use the metaphor of thirst?

6. Are there unhelpful ways people try to quench their thirst either physically or spiritually? What are some ways you have made this mistake?

Read the memory verse together

"Jesus said to her, 'Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again. The water that I will give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life.'"

John 4:13-14

7. Discuss this statement:

Without physical thirst we would not seek water and would die of dehydration, even so, without spiritual thirst and longing we would not seek God and would spiritually die. Thirst is a gift from the Holy Spirit.

8. Being thirsty is unpleasant. Will God allow us to become uncomfortable so that we will seek things that really matter?

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 22, 2021

The week’s memory verse is **John 4:13-14**.

Write the verse here:

Keep this verse in front of you this week. Place it where you can read and recite it as the week progresses. Maybe make it the lock screen on your computer or phone. Maybe highlight it in your Bible and leave your Bible open. Each time you pass by your Bible or open up your laptop or phone, practice the verse silently or out loud.

Read John 4:1-8

Jesus’ human nature caused Him to be weak, tired, hungry, and thirsty.

Read Hebrews 4:14-16

Jesus can sympathize with our weaknesses because He was human. As we begin to talk about what it means to thirst, the first thing to remind ourselves is that we can confidently draw near God’s throne of grace in our physical need because Jesus understands. He knows what it is like to be weak, tired, hungry, and thirsty.

Do you realize we can also confidently draw near God’s throne of grace when we are spiritually thirsty? Jesus understands our physical weaknesses, but He also understands the yearning and longing we feel as we grapple with our spiritual thirst. Physical thirst calls us to pay attention to our bodies. We are unable to think about much else until we quench the thirst that parches our throat. Spiritual thirst calls us to pay attention to God. We can confidently draw close to God when conflict brews in our inner world. When we feel the friction inside as we contemplate where we are in life and where we are with God, it is tempting to turn away from Him because spiritual thirst is uncomfortable. We may try to dull spiritual thirst with world comforts, but only God can satisfy the longing growing inside of us.

Spiritual thirst is God calling out to us and asking us to pay attention to where we are on our spiritual journey. If we settle into the world's comforts, we lose our way. We will seek the comforts of this life over Him. Thirst helps loosen our ties to the world's comforts and brings us on a journey closer to God. God calls us to listen to the longing in our inner world. He encourages us to pay attention to the yearning instead of pushing it away. The natural inclination is to ignore it, but spiritual thirst is evidence that the Holy Spirit is calling us to a deeper place in our relationship with the Lord.

What concerns you about facing your spiritual thirst with God?
What excites you about facing your spiritual thirst with God?
Talk with God about how you answered the above questions.
Speak with honesty.

Pray this prayer by St. Augustine

“Late have I loved thee, O beauty so ancient and so new; late have I loved thee: for behold you were within me, and I outside; and I sought you outside and in my unloveliness fell upon those lovely things that You had made. You were with me, and I was not with You. I was kept from You by those things, yet had they not been in You, they would not have been at all. You called and tried to break open my deafness: and You sent forth Your beams and shone upon me and chased away my blindness: You breathed fragrance upon me, and I drew in my breath and I do now pant for You: I taste You, and now hunger and thirst for You: You touched me, and I have burned for Your peace.”

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 23, 2021

Write this week’s memory verse, John 4:13-14, on a notecard leaving every other word with only the first letter. Practice the verse with the missing words using the first letter as a clue to help you remember.

Read John 4:9-26

Strict followers of Jewish law would not pass through Samaria because they believed the Samaritans would make them unclean. The Samaritans assimilated with non-Jewish people, intermarrying with the Mesopotamian colonists. Constant tension challenged the two groups. The Jewish people considered the Samaritans to be in a continual state of uncleanness, so the Jews avoided the Samaritans by taking a longer route when traveling from Judea to Galilee. Jesus traveled through Samaria. He risked scandal and uncleanness to meet the Samaritan woman at Jacob’s Well.

Jesus comes to the well at noon, the hottest time of the day, to draw water. Typically, the village women would come to the well to draw water in the morning or evening when the temperature was cooler, but the Samaritan woman arrives when she knows no one else will be there. The woman is an outcast as a Samaritan, but she is even an outcast with the Samaritans due to her sinful life. Jesus meets the Samaritan woman at the well, breaking all cultural norms and traditions, even asking her for a drink of water.

As you contemplate Jesus taking risks to meet the Samaritan woman, what stirs in your soul?

Jesus seeks the woman out, and He does not shy away from confronting her with her sin. With kindness and compassion, He reveals her sin while sharing knowledge of her entire life. When God confronts us with our sin during times of thirst, our first reaction is to focus on the problem, but God’s focus is His love for us. In Jesus’ encounter with the Samaritan woman at Jacob’s well, His omniscient knowledge comes with kindness and compassion. In thirst, God is working for good, but sometimes we misinterpret good. God aims to help us realize His Presence in our thirst. We have to remember He is in control, and He is at work to draw us closer to Him in love. Without Him, we are lost for eternity, but in Jesus we have a life with Him now and for eternity as He tells the woman at the well.

When spiritual thirst makes us uncomfortable, we tend to lean into life's comforts. God desires us to lean into Him. His purpose in confronting our sin is to grow us into a better place in life by knowing Him in a deeper relationship. He is calling us in love. He wants us to become like Him by the power of the Holy Spirit, and slowly, over time, continually move closer and closer to Him and further and further away from sin. We will never be perfect. Perfection is not the goal. The goal is to love God and to follow as He leads.

Read Romans 5:8

As you contemplate God going out of His way to meet us in our sin, what stirs in your soul?

Pray this prayer by A.W. Tozer:

“O God and Father, I repent of my sinful preoccupation with visible things. The world has been too much with me. Thou hast been here and I knew it not. I have been blind to Thy Presence. Open my eyes that I may behold Thee in and around me. For Christ's sake, Amen.”

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 24, 2021

Write this week’s memory verse, **John 4:13-14**, on a notecard leaving the opposite words you did yesterday with only the first letter. Practice the verse with the missing words, using the first letter as a clue to help you remember.

Read John 4:27-42

In verses 32-34, we see that Jesus’s focus is not on physical food but spiritual food. The disciples did not understand. Neither do we. More often than not, we do not want to face our spiritual thirst. We prefer a quick fix. Human nature prefers a fast result over a slow period of change. Our spiritual journey takes time, and this can create frustration because we are impatient creatures. It takes courage to face God in our spiritual thirst.

Do you prefer a quick fix, or are you willing to do the hard work of change?

Worldly remedies that dull the longing are temporary fixes, and the more we choose the quick answers, the deeper our thirst will grow.

Each time God calls us closer to Him in a new way, the journey starts hard but moves with a gradual release of the tension found at the start line. The world’s way is easy at first, and it is tempting to take the easy path, but Jesus calls us to move toward Him in love. He stirs spiritual thirst within us, and we must pay attention and become dependent upon the Holy Spirit’s work. As we surrender our will to God’s, we see fruit over time, but it takes focus and determination to let spiritual thirst drive us to dependence.

In following Jesus, has there been a time when you let Him lead you to change? What happened?

If not, what has kept you from growth and change?

Thirst is an indication of God calling us to change. Change can be challenging to accept, especially if we come to the Lord believing God’s will is to make us happy, bestowing material blessings on us and giving us what we desire. The Samaritan woman tried the things of this world, but when she met with Jesus at Jacob’s well, she realized He is the answer. The living water He gives springs up in us by the power of His Holy Spirit, giving us life in Him, now and for eternity.

In our human nature, we will not be able to produce a spiritual life on our own. Once we realize Jesus is the only way to eternal life and true fellowship with God, we must lay down our will for His. When we do, we begin to rely on His Spirit. The Holy Spirit brings the change needed, but requires our participation. God provides times of thirst to call us back to Him in dependence. As we surrender to His Spirit, God brings good in our life through inward change. The pathway of change begins when we start uncovering our spiritual thirst with God in His Word and prayer.

Meditate on **Isaiah 43:18-19**

“Remember not the former things, nor consider the things of old. Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.”

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 25, 2021

Challenge yourself to recite **John 4:13-14** by memory as best you can.

Proverbs 3:5-6 says,

“Trust in the Lord with all your heart and do not lean on your own understanding.

In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.”

In our focus and determination to follow Jesus, the goal is to progress toward Him continually. When things are going well, though, it is easier to trust our abilities rather than to follow Him.

Is this something you have found to be true in your life? Why or why not?

Read Proverbs 3:7-8 and Matthew 7:24-27

How can thirst be a path to wisdom in God?

Thirst reminds us of our need for God. It sends us on the journey of finding confidence in Him rather than in ourselves and our abilities. If our faith rests in ourselves, we will not have Him as our foundation when difficult times come. Thirst can be the beginning of a deepening trust in Him as we move beyond our understanding, letting knowledge about Him move from what we know in our minds to a deep trust and reliance on Him in our relationship.

Thirst seems to be a roadblock in our spiritual journey, but what if we saw spiritual longing as a way to help us find the road back to dependence on God for life’s journey? How might our perspective change?

Jeremiah 6:16a

“Thus says the Lord: ‘Stand by the roads, and look, and ask for the ancient paths, where the good way is; and walk in it, and find rest for your souls.’”

When our souls’ thirst, we find rest when we look to God for direction.

Take a few minutes to contemplate if you earnestly seek God. If you realize you do not, reflect on why this is true. Is it because you are busy? Maybe you know you have been living religious rules rather than a relationship. Perhaps, you are beginning to realize you do not trust God. It could be you are afraid of earnestly seeking Him for what you believe He might say. Discovering why you do not earnestly seek God in your life will give you guidance and direction forward in your spiritual thirst. Sit quietly with God for a few minutes. Spend time in prayer about what you are discovering with Him.

Pray the words of Psalm 63:1

“O God, you are my God; earnestly I seek you;
my soul thirsts for you;
my flesh faints for you,
as in a dry and weary land where there is no water.”

FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 26, 2021

Challenge yourself to recite **John 4:13-14** by memory to a friend or family member.

A significant gap can exist between who we profess to be and how we live. God’s Presence guides us to do things pleasing to Him while helping us be consistent with what we say and how we live. Sometimes thirst rises because of the inconsistencies displayed in our life.

Thirst is an invitation to return when inconsistencies arise in our spiritual journey.

In **1 Timothy 6:11-12**, the Apostle Paul tells Timothy,

“But as for you, O man of God, flee these things. Pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, steadfastness, gentleness. Fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called and about which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses.”

Thirst calls us back to pursue the Father and follow Him in the good fight of faith. Thirst is an invitation to return to Him in righteousness, godliness, faith, love, steadfastness, and gentleness. Thankfully, God does not call us to focus on each of these individual characteristics all at one time. He calls us first to focus on Him and allow Him to pinpoint where He sees inconsistencies displayed in our life. We can’t get to intimacy with Him except when we allow ourselves to be vulnerable, real and honest.

Do you feel God working through spiritual thirst to pinpoint areas of inconsistencies in your walk with Him? For example, how might you expect righteousness and commitment in others but not live the same standards you expect? It could be that you are frustrated when others do not live their faith in love and gentleness, yet you realize you also do not live what you profess.

During this time of Renewal, how may thirst may be at work to reveal inconsistencies in your walk with Him?

and his ears are open to their prayer.

Thirst calls us to come to God. God is calling our souls to thirst for Him above all else. Thirst makes us feel lost, but God is calling us to be found in Him. He is waiting for us to come to Him in our thirst.

Psalm 34:8 says,

“Oh, taste and see that the Lord is good! Blessed is the man who takes refuge in him!”

Thirst calls us to taste and see that the Lord is good. When we take refuge in Him in our thirst, we will be satisfied. Let spiritual thirst call you to taste and see the Lord is good. Come to Him. Open your heart to Him and receive His love, mercy, kindness, and compassion. He is good, and when we allow our thirst to move us toward Him, we begin to understand how He is good. We learn to live like Him. His goodness changes us from the inside out, which is painful at first but eventually brings peace, inner joy, and contentment.

Imagine living with true peace, inner joy, and contentment. How different would your life be?


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Discovering Him, His will at work in our heart, mind, and soul, changes us inside. Our circumstances might not change, but when we lay our heads down on the pillow at night, we rest knowing we are safely in His Hands. The world may move in one hundred different directions (Ephesians 4:14 says “so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes.”), but our heart moves to Him in love keeping the direction of our life on course towards God. He is our true north. Hebrews 13:8 says, “Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.” Thirst calls us back to our true north.

Pray the Lord’s Prayer

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. 

READ ALOUD TOGETHER

Matthew 7:7-12

Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives; he who seeks finds; and to him who knocks, the door will be opened. 'Which of you, if his son asks for bread, will give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a snake? If you, then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask him! So, in everything, do to others what you would have them do to you, for this sums up the Law and the Prophets.

1. Are you comfortable asking questions? Why or why not?
2. Does the idea of asking God questions comfort or disturb you? Why?

6. God has given us a pathway to seek Him called search. Sometimes search makes us uncomfortable. How have times of search found you uncomfortable in the process?

8. We need to make room in our lives to ask questions and enter the process of search. Has anyone in the group given up something or added something (like a new Spiritual discipline) during the season of Lent to create more space and time for God?

Keep this verse in front of you this week. Place it where you can read and recite it as the week progresses. Maybe print the verse out on a piece of paper and hang it in a hallway in your home. Each time you pass by the verse, work on putting the words to memory.

God is omnipresent, which means His divine presence encompasses the entirety of the universe. In simple terms, it means He is everywhere all the time. There is nowhere that is void of the presence of God.

Psalm 139:7-8 says,

Where shall I go from your Spirit? Or where shall I flee from your presence? If I ascend to heaven, you are there! If I make my bed in Sheol, you are there!

Though God’s Presence is everywhere, we must be active in recognizing He is with us and at work in us. Search (the next step on the Journey Tool) is not a passive activity. Seeking God requires action on our part. Contemplate what it means to seek God as you read the verses below:

Deuteronomy 4:29: *But from there you will seek the LORD your God and you will find him, if you search after him with all your heart and with all your soul.*

1 Chronicles 16:10-11: *Glory in his holy name; let the hearts of those who seek the LORD rejoice! Seek the LORD and his strength; seek his presence continually!*

1 Chronicles 22:19a: *Now set your mind and heart to seek the LORD your God.*

Psalm 105:4: *Seek the LORD and his strength; seek his presence continually!*

Jeremiah 29:13: *You will seek me and find me, when you seek me with all your heart.*

Seeking God requires action on our part, but remember, anytime we add something new to our life--a pattern, behavior, or new way of thinking as we are doing during Renewal--it usually requires us to remove something. In Week One of Renewal, we asked you to consider letting go of something during Lent. Did you know that by participating in Renewal you are seeking God? You are creating more space and time for God in your life, a practical step of search. Be encouraged! You are actively seeking God by participating in Renewal.

Pray this prayer by St. Augustine

“O Lord my God, I believe in you, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Insofar as I can, insofar as you have given me the power, I have sought you. I became weary and I labored. O Lord my God, my sole hope, help me to believe and never to cease seeking you. Grant that I may always and ardently seek out your countenance. Give me the strength to seek you, for you help me to find you and you have more and more given me the hope of finding you. Here I am before you with my firmness and my infirmity. Preserve the first and heal the second. Here I am before you with my strength and my ignorance. Where you have opened the door to me, welcome me at the entrance; where you have closed the door to me, open to my cry; enable me to remember you, to understand you, and to love you. Amen.”

TUESDAY, MARCH 2, 2021

Write this week’s memory verse, **Matthew 7:7-12**, as you read it out loud.

Do you realize we can fully face God with our questions?

Asking God our questions with a desire to know Him more leads us to Him in the midst of search. Asking our questions in search is not to question God’s Sovereignty, but to be truthful with Him about where we are in the journey.

Do you realize there are over 3,000 questions in Scripture? The Bible is a book of questions! It is okay to ask questions. It is courageous to come to God with your questions, pouring out your heart in honesty. The Psalms, for example, are filled with honest questions. The Psalms authors do not shy away from asking God about their hurt, doubt, disappointment, anger, fear, feelings of loss, rejection, and abandonment. For example:

Psalm 10:1: *Why, O LORD, do you stand far away?
Why do you hide yourself in times of trouble?*

Psalm 42:9: *I say to God, my rock: “Why have you forgotten me? Why do I go mourning because of the oppression of the enemy?”*

Psalm 43:2: *For you are the God in whom I take refuge; why have you rejected me? Why do I go about mourning because of the oppression of the enemy?*

Psalm 44:23-24: *Awake! Why are you sleeping, O Lord? Rouse yourself! Do not reject us forever!
Why do you hide your face? Why do you forget our affliction and oppression?*

Did you grow up in an environment in which you were allowed to pursue God with your questions? If not, what did you do with your questions? Did you ignore them? Did you hide them? Did you discount them? Did you shame yourself for having them?

Read John 11:30-35

How does Jesus address Mary’s disappointment?

Read John 20:24-29

How does Jesus address Thomas’ doubt?

Take time to be honest with God. Discuss with Him your hurt, doubt, disappointment, anger, fear, feelings of loss, rejection, abandonment, or other places of struggle which cause you to have questions. In the Psalms, we discover it is okay to ask questions, but we also learn how to end our time of seeking God in our questions as we wait on Him to work and move in our hearts, minds and souls. Through the Psalms, we know to praise Him for who He is and remind ourselves of His character and love. End your prayer time in the same way as the Psalmists. Remind yourself of how Jesus spoke with Mary and Thomas. Thank Him for His kindness, love, and compassion as we ask questions and search.

Psalm 10:17-18: *O LORD, you hear the desire of the afflicted; you will strengthen their heart; you will incline your ear to do justice to the fatherless and the oppressed, so that man who is of the earth may strike terror no more.*

Psalm 42:11 and 43:5: *Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God.*

Psalm 44:26: *Rise up; come to our help! Redeem us for the sake of your steadfast love!*

Write this week’s memory verse, **Matthew 7:7-12**, as much as you can without looking. Fill in the places you are still working on remembering.

Lamentations 3:25: *The LORD is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him.*

Often, we experience God’s sovereignty, wisdom and kindness revealed in challenging circumstances. Search requires us to stay in pursuit of God while waiting for Him to work.

Think about a time in your life in which you were searching for answers to a challenging circumstance. Maybe you experienced confusion and pressure as you tried to determine what to do about a job. Perhaps you lost a job. Maybe you experienced a painful breakup or the loss of a close friend. It could be you failed at something you believed was a sure thing. Maybe you turned to something to cope and what you turned to is now an addiction from which you desperately want to be freed. Possibly you or a loved one were diagnosed with a health issue. Maybe anxiety and depression have enveloped your world, and you feel lost and discouraged. It could be your loved one has taken a destructive path, and you do not know how to help. Perhaps you grew up in a dysfunctional family, and you are trying to figure out what it means to be healthy. Maybe you are in a difficult marriage. Possibly, you are not getting along with family or close friends. Perhaps you spent too much money and have found yourself in credit card debt. Maybe you are struggling with getting older. It could be you are caring for a child with special needs or an aging loved one.

When contemplating where you are on your spiritual journey, do you automatically focus on specific aspects of your life? Why or why not?

It is easy to imagine our spiritual journey separate from everyday life, but daily life is our spiritual journey.

Once we have accepted Christ as our Savior, He becomes our life. With Him at work in us as we follow Him each day, every part of our world becomes His as we open up to Him.

Therefore, any problem is a problem that we take to Him. Our human nature tells us to figure it out and fix it, but God is calling us to follow Him, seek Him, and pursue His wisdom. As we search Him for answers, slowly, He is at work to change us in the challenging circumstances.

The struggles we experience will vary, but we lose our way each time we solely focus on the battle. God is asking us to focus on Him. Search guides us to learn to trust God as we seek Him day in and day out.

Read Psalm 9:10

Sometimes everything in our life is going well, yet, the longing, dissonance, and dissatisfaction we experience in times of thirst keep us up at night. We don't understand where it is coming from, but it is coming from God. He is stirring these feelings to draw us closer to Him. As we persist in the thirst, letting it drive us to search, we find a pathway to focus on God. We seek Him to understand what is going on inside. God knows us better than we know ourselves. He knows why we think, feel, and behave the way we do. He knows what is best for us. Through a time of search, He may lead us to a new job, to further our education, or to a different plan of His that we currently do not understand or recognize.

What is God showing you through this time of Renewal?
Talk to Him in prayer about what you see.

Pray the words of Psalm 139:1-6:

“O LORD, you have searched me and known me! You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from afar. You search out my path and my lying down and are acquainted with all my ways. Even before a word is on my tongue, behold, O LORD, you know it altogether. You hem me in, behind and before, and lay your hand upon me. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is high; I cannot attain it.”

THURSDAY, MARCH 4, 2021

Challenge yourself to recite **Matthew 7:7-12** by memory as best you can.

Search calls us to discover God and His goodness in a broken world. As we turn to God in surrender, He will begin to shape our character and conduct through His Spirit, who is already at work in us. Search brings us back to God’s Word as His guide. Search requires us to study the Scriptures, seeking God first.

If we turn the yearning of thirst into a longing to seek God, we will begin to see how He and His ways are good. God’s Word helps us learn God’s goodness and how we can pursue Him in faithfulness. Seeking to know God, to know and become like Jesus, will not happen void of the Bible being a part of our life.

The Gospel of John teaches us that Jesus’ character displays the qualities for which we learn God’s character. In Colossians, we learn that the incarnation of Jesus makes the invisible God visible by showing us what He is like and how He behaves.

Colossians 1:15: *He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation.*

Colossians 1:19: *For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell.*

The human being Jesus is at the same time the Son of God who came into our world to first save us from sin and then lead us, by the power of His Spirit at work in us, day by day in this life and eventually for eternity.

Romans 6:22: *But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the fruit you get leads to sanctification and its end, eternal life.*

Search brings us back to God’s Word, helping us learn who God is, who Jesus is, and who the Holy Spirit is. Search guides us to set our minds on God first through His Word, to discover Him, His ways and how He is at work in us to change us from the inside out.

As you seek God to discover where you are on your journey, start with prayer and God’s Word. They are essential components in search. Maybe today you realize your next step is to reengage with God in the Scriptures.

Hebrews 4:12: *For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart.*

John 8:31-32: *So Jesus said to the Jews who had believed him, ‘If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.*

Over and over again, God will guide us as He puts us on a path to a new area of growth and freedom in Him. We will go through this process repeatedly in our relationship of knowing Him and becoming like Him. Each time the process begins with thirst and then moves to search. Over the next few weeks, we will see how the process continues to a place of know, experience, depth, and community in God.

For today, thank God that from the beginning, He had a plan for us in Jesus. Thank Him for His Word and how in it we see history moving throughout the Old Testament, pointing to Jesus. Thank Him for the New Testament which tells of Jesus’ life, death, and resurrection and His promised return. Thank Him for His great love and for His Holy Spirit, who resides in us and brings us new life. Thank God for the hope we have in Him now and for eternity because of who Jesus is. Thank God for His love and His grace.

Pray Romans 15:4

“For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures, we might have hope.”

FRIDAY, MARCH 5, 2021

Challenge yourself to recite **Matthew 7:7-12** by memory to a friend or family member.

When we experience times of thirst, we must choose to step into search on our journey. It is easy to protest and explain to God that we do not want to experience a time of longing. We can ask Him not to stir it up, and we can decide to ignore it. We can even become angry and distance ourselves from God.

Instead, going to God in the longing presents a pathway to a more profound revelation of Him.

Psalm 107:9: *For he satisfies the longing soul, and the hungry soul he fills with good things.*

Good things in God’s eyes are different than the good things we immediately think are important. When we contemplate good things, we may tend to think of material blessings but God’s goodness works to give us security in His love. Understanding who we are as His child, creates a deeper faith in us which is of greater worth than gold.

1 Peter 1:6-9: *In this you rejoice, though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been grieved by various trials, so that the tested genuineness of your faith—more precious than gold that perishes though it is tested by fire—may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ. Though you have not seen him, you love him. Though you do not now see him, you believe in him and rejoice with joy that is inexpressible and filled with glory, obtaining the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls.*

It is not in our nature to ask God to bring us a greater revelation of Him, as we tend to think only of what we believe will create good in our circumstances. In times of search, what might God be at work to do?

Search creates times when we learn God’s love more profoundly. We grow to believe Him, and we begin to rejoice as we realize who we are in Him now as His child and who He is creating us to be for eternity. Search helps us remember God’s good is the work He is about first in our inner life as He draws us closer to Him in love so that we shine His love in this broken world.

Pray this prayer of St. Francis of Assisi

“ Lord, make me an instrument of your peace:
where there is hatred, let me sow love;
where there is injury, pardon;
where there is doubt, faith;
where there is despair, hope;
where there is darkness, light;
where there is sadness, joy.

O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek
to be consoled as to console,
to be understood as to understand,
to be loved as to love.

For it is in giving that we receive,
it is in pardoning that we are pardoned,
and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.
Amen.”

Do you have **Matthew 7:7-12** memorized? If not, work on reciting it before you begin today's study.

Matthew 7:7-12: *Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives; he who seeks finds; and to him who knocks, the door will be opened. 'Which of you, if his son asks for bread, will give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a snake? If you, then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask him! So, in everything, do to others what you would have them do to you, for this sums up the Law and the Prophets.*

We must come to God in humility. In doing so, we understand that as we ask God in prayer, our priority is to seek Him and His will. As we persevere in the journey, continuing to knock, God will provide for us, but His provision may look different than we expect.

How have you experienced this in your walk with God? Because change in Him is a process, we can feel frustrated when things don't look as we expect them to. Understanding we can try softer rather than harder and try different because God is at work gives us the courage to keep moving forward to knowing and becoming like Jesus. We ask God for what we want, but we come back to the truth that He loves us and will give us what we need. In love, God's priority is to help us know Him more and grow us more and more into His Son's character.

Maybe you have tried to change, but you feel like you have gotten nowhere in the journey to know and become like Jesus. Imagine a woman incredibly hard on herself for not overcoming an issue of unforgiveness in her life. Picture her focused on it to the point of despair. Visualize her heaping shame upon herself and refusing to receive grace in her walk with God. In her anguish, God sends a close friend to remind the woman what

she has overcome with God in the journey. The friend helps her recall different struggles from her past.

For example, at one time, the woman spent much of her days angry with her husband and children. Now the people who know her rarely witness anger. The conversation with the friend helps the woman see how God has been faithful to help her overcome anger. She realizes God will also be faithful in her journey to learn forgiveness.

Think back over the time in which you have known Jesus as your Savior. In what ways are you more like Him than who you were when you first gave your life to Him?

Celebrate with God in prayer over some of the good changes that have happened with Him in your life.

Talk with a family member and/or friend and spend some time celebrating!

GROUP CURRICULUM

FOR THE WEEK of
MARCH 7, 2021

We come to know Jesus by making Him part of all aspects of our life. We come to know Him by walking with Him every day. He wants to be involved in our daily life choices and behaviors as much as He wants to meet us by going to church and reading the Bible and praying. To know Christ is to walk with Christ. This is the deepest meaning of salvation. Jesus wants to bring salvation to every part of our lives. He wants to transform us into good people from whom good things naturally flow. He wants to change the way we think, feel, and act through our relationship with Him.

READ OUT LOUD TOGETHER

John 17:1-5

Father, the hour has come. Glorify your Son, that your Son may glorify you. For you granted him authority over all people that he might give eternal life to all those you have given him. Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent. I have brought you glory on earth by finishing the work you gave me to do. And now, Father, glorify me in your presence with the glory I had with you before the world began.

1. In the Journey Tool, we are entering into the season of know. In know God starts to give us direction and provides answers to some of the questions and issues we have been searching. When we suspect we know the changes God is leading us to make, it is time to clarify & confirm. We ask "Father, what are the specifics of the changes you want me to make?" We also must consider How we confirm what you believe God is telling you to do? When you believe God is leading you to make a change how do you clarify and confirm His will?
2. God will lead us to have confidence in the things we are coming to know and understand by sharing what we are learning with a person who can listen and ask us further questions. Who is a person you could share with what you are learning?
3. One-way God clarifies and confirms in a season of know is to lead us to make a plan. The plan helps us ask, "How will I integrate what I have come to know into my life with practical steps?" What excites you or concerns you about making a plan? Why?

4. Remember that if the change you are making relates to your life in ways that we don't always think of as spiritual, such as health, relationships, or finances, it is essential to prioritize spending time with God in His Word and prayer. The plan you map out with God will only succeed if you continue to put Him first. Is anyone in the group at a place where they can share the plan God is beginning to direct you to implement? Share how your group members can support you on the journey.

Read Jesus' prayer in John 17:20-26:

I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me. Father, I desire that they also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory that you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world. O righteous Father, even though the world does not know you, I know you, and these know that you have sent me. I made known to them your name, and I will continue to make it known, that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them.

5. Our destiny is to be like Christ in every aspect of our life—how we think, act, and feel. Jesus is praying for it, working on it, and has a plan to accomplish it. What would you be like if you were more like Jesus?
6. Does it encourage you that this is God's plan for you?
7. This week we celebrate the 20th Anniversary of Jacob's Well. How has God impacted your life at Jacob's Well? How is God leading you now in your walk with Him through His work in His church?

The week’s memory work is **John 17:1-5**:

When Jesus had spoken these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, “Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son that the Son may glorify you, since you have given him authority over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him. And this is eternal life, that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. I glorified you on earth, having accomplished the work that you gave me to do. And now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had with you before the world existed.”

The memory work this week is made up of five verses. Today focus on reciting verse one “When Jesus had spoken these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, ‘Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son that the Son may glorify you’” Set a timer throughout the day to remind yourself to practice reciting verse one.

The “know” of the vision statement of Jacob’s Well (“Wherever we are on our journey, we will take steps together to know and become like Jesus”) and the next step on the Journey Tool (know) are two aspects of growth in our relationship with God. To first know Jesus in a relationship, we grow to learn who He is in the Scriptures, prayer, attending church, and alongside others. Knowing Jesus helps us realize we are known, valued, and loved by God.

We also come to know Jesus by making Him part of all aspects of our life. We come to know Him by walking with Him every day. He wants to be involved in our daily life choices and behaviors as much as He wants to meet us by going to church and reading the Bible and praying. To know Christ is to walk with Christ. This is the deepest meaning of salvation. Jesus wants to bring salvation to every part of life. He wants to transform us into good people from whom good things naturally flow. He wants to change the way we think, feel, and act through our relationship with Him. God loves us so much as His child that He has given us His Son and His Holy Spirit.

John 14:16-17

And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever, even the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, for he dwells with you and will be in you.

Know, the next step on the Journey Tool begins when we live our identity as a child of God. We move from trying hard on our own to be good to living free in Christ. We learn the grace of God as we try softer and different as we partner with the Holy Spirit, who is already at work in us. The Holy Spirit helps us to know Jesus further and become like Him over time, step by step on the journey.

Do you know where you are in your journey? If you don't, let God guide you in this time of Renewal.

If you know where you are in your journey, what concerns you or excites you about where you are?

Wherever you are is entirely okay because, at Jacob's Well, we take steps together. Renewal is a time to support one another as we discover where we are on our journey and our individual next step.

Do you know that from the beginning of Jacob's Well, the church's mission has been to help people discover where they are on their journey and to help them take steps to know and become like Jesus? As we celebrate Jacob's Well's 20th anniversary this week, how have you come to know Jesus in a deeper relationship through God's work in His church?

The week’s memory work is **John 17:1-5**. It is made up of five verses. Today focus on reciting verses one and two:

When Jesus had spoken these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, “Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son that the Son may glorify you, since you have given him authority over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him.”

Set a timer throughout the day to remind yourself to repeat the verses. Knowing where we are on our journey does not mean we know exactly where we are going. The act of seeking God to know Him and know where He is guiding us is a process that takes time.

Hebrews 11:8 says,

By faith, Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going.

We learn through Abraham that God will help us discover where we are on the journey, but He doesn’t give an immediate complete and clear picture of how He will work in us and in our life to guide us to know and become like Jesus on our journey with Him. Abraham’s story helps us learn to believe God and to have a favorable view of the future, even when the future is not clear. We know the Holy Spirit is at work to change us, but all we may see is the present moment. Knowing Jesus gives us the security to follow Him in the journey through all the ups, downs, twists, and turns of life. Belief helps us trust God on the journey, taking one step at a time forward in faith.

Hebrews 11:1

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.

John 6:28-29:

Then they said to him, “What must we do, to be doing the works of God?” Jesus answered them, “This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent.”

All change begins with belief:

- The belief God loves us.
- The belief that God can change us.
- The belief that God is good and the change He has for us will bring life, health and peace.

God is your Father, and He loves you. Do you have faith God loves you? Say the following statement out loud three times:

The Father has gifted you the Holy Spirit. Do you have faith the Holy Spirit is at work in you? Say the following statement out loud three times:

Holy Spirit, I receive You, and I believe You are working to transform me to think, feel and act like Jesus.

Titus 3:4-7

But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

How does the hope of who we are in Christ and our future life with Him help you pursue God in the uncertainties of today as He leads you in your journey to know and become like Jesus?

Read **1 John 5:20**. In March of 2001, when Jacob's Well launched in Delong Middle School, the church followed God in faith. Through the first five years of its existence, every year brought uncertainty as the church waited to see if the school district would renew their lease. The church moved from Delong Middle School to Altoona High School to South Middle School and back to Altoona High School before God opened the door for the land where the church now has its home. Even with the land in place, so many pieces had to come together for the building's first phase.

As we celebrate the church's 20th anniversary this week, let the faithfulness of God for His church bring you comfort as you work through the Know section of the Journey Tool. God gives us the guidance we need to keep moving forward in the journey even though we do not have all the answers. Seeking God helps us keep moving forward in faith one small step at a time.

Pray for God to strengthen your faith during this time of Renewal.

The week’s memory work is **John 17:1-5**. It is made up of five verses. Today focus on reciting verses one, two, and three:

When Jesus had spoken these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, “Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son that the Son may glorify you, since you have given him authority over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him. And this is eternal life, that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent.”

Set a timer throughout the day to remind yourself to repeat the verses.

In our relationship with God, we will grow to know His next step for us in our journey. His ways give us a path that we can see as we know Him.

Psalm 16:11: *You make known to me the path of life; in your presence there is fullness of joy; at your right hand are pleasures forevermore.*

Psalm 25:4: *Make me to know your ways, O Lord; teach me your paths.*

Proverbs 2:6: *For the Lord gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding.*

Psalm 119:105: *Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path.*

Know is the section of the Journey Tool to investigate and confirm how we believe God is leading us. We start with the Scriptures, pray, journal, contemplate where we are in the journey, and God begins to show us our next step. He reveals the path in front of us. In this process, it is helpful to talk with trusted mentors and friends. Having deep conversations with those we trust, praying, and seeking God together, helps us confirm how we believe God is leading us in our journey.

- Why is it essential to test what we believe to what the Scriptures say?
- How do you confirm what you believe God is telling you to do?

Now is the time to create a plan for the next step in the journey. As you start to see how God leads, sit with Him, and map out a plan for change. In the plan, make sure you resolve to have fun in the process with God. Connect with Him in love. Seek others who will help you in the journey. The thought of change can overwhelm us, but remember Jesus is at work in you through the Holy Spirit. Be inspired to learn a new path with Him rather than focus on a problem.

The plan you map out with God will only succeed if you continue to put Him first. In the practice of doing what you feel He is calling you to do to know and become like Jesus, plan practical steps but set a priority of spending time with God in His Word and prayer above all else. Create space for reflection to talk with Him about how you see His Spirit at work in you.

Pray for wisdom on how best to practice the new skill, replace the unhealthy behavior, or attend to the change. You will need time to actively apply what God teaches you so that the head knowledge acquired moves to action and experience.

What is God showing you about where you are on your journey, and what your next step is through Renewal?

Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? As it is written, 'For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered.' No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

We have a core conviction that when people take steps to get closer to God, they are changed, and they become change agents in this world.

Our hope is that you would come to know Christ and would better come to know the people and staff at Jacob's Well. And that you would have a clear picture of what this church is all about. Our goal is not to get you to become a member of Jacob's Well. Our goal is that you would be able to identify and take your next step towards God.

Most of you have come to Membership at the Well because you believe that was your Next Step towards God. If your next step is to make a commitment to become a member of the Well, we would be delighted. If God leads you in another direction, we will also delight that you are moving closer to God. So, I encourage you to participate, listen, have fun, pray, ask lots of questions (we love questions) as we take our next steps toward God together.

Enjoy the Journey, Paul

During Renewal, God may be leading you to become a member of the church. If so, ask for the date for the next membership class. Maybe your next step is baptism. At Jacob's Well we call people to baptism by immersion as a testimony of salvation. Today try and recite John 17:1-5 by memory:

When Jesus had spoken these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, “Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son that the Son may glorify you, since you have given him authority over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him. And this is eternal life, that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. I glorified you on earth, having accomplished the work that you gave me to do. And now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had with you before the world existed.

Growing to know God’s will and wholeheartedly following Him is an opportune time for the enemy to work against the people of God.

1 Peter 5:8 *Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary, the devil, prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour.*

Spiritual warfare is a real threat on the journey, especially as we seek to know and become like Christ. Part of the process in know is recognizing how the enemy might be at work to stop us in our pursuit of Christ. The devil wants us to quit. He does not want us to experience more of God and grow in-depth in our relationship with the Father. The devil does not want us to change, and He does not want others to see God at work in us as individuals and the church.

Running our race means we do not give up when it gets hard, but we pray for His strength, and we keep going, not trying harder but by trusting God over our fear. We do not need to be afraid of the enemy at work against us, but we do need to be diligent in our pursuit of God. We will grow to know Jesus more deeply in the fight of faith, because God is with us. He will never leave us. He is at work in us, but we will miss seeing how He carries us if we rely on our strength instead of His or if we give up when it gets hard. Change in Jesus is life-giving. As we go through the process of change in Him, circling around and around the steps of the Journey Tool, we will continue to grow and find the abundant life Jesus promises in **John 10:10** “The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly.”

During Legacy, Pastor Paul reminded us that:



The week’s memory work is **Philippians 2:12-13**:

Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, so now, not only as in my presence but much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure.

Create simple drawings to represent a few of the words in the memory work.

Write out the verses with what you created to help you begin to memorize the words.

This week in the Journey Tool is the week we study the nature of what it means to experience change. At this point in Renewal, you may not have identified with God what you desire Him to help you change, but this week provides information on how to experience change in the journey.

Experience looks like taking the plan you created for change and implementing the steps into your life. Experience is the time in which you start to do the work of change in partnership with God.

Philippians 1:6 *And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.*

God commits to complete His work in us. He is asking us to commit to Him too.

How committed are you to partner with God for change on your spiritual journey?

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus teaches that the wide road is the popular path. The wide road starts easy and then gets hard. In the same respect, there is a narrow road that very few people choose on the journey. The narrow road is more challenging to discover. It starts hard and gradually becomes easier as we partner with Jesus for growth and change. As

Christ-followers, we are to be committed to the narrow road as referenced in Matthew 7:12-14 “So whatever you wish that others would do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets. ‘Enter by the narrow gate. For the gate is wide and the way is easy that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. For the gate is narrow and the way is hard that leads to life, and those who find it are few.’”

The narrow road is where our relationship with the Lord gives us the courage to begin to do the thing God is calling us to do. Remember, this is not the place we try harder; it is the place to partner in a relationship with God to experience change and spiritual growth.

What does becoming more committed in your spiritual journey look like in practical terms?

Pray:

“Lord, because you have made me, I owe you the whole of my love; because you have redeemed me, I owe you the whole of myself; because you have promised so much, I owe you my whole being. Moreover, I owe you as much more love than myself as you are greater than I, for whom you gave yourself and to whom you promised yourself. I pray you, Lord, make me taste by love what I taste by knowledge; let me know by love what I know by understanding. I owe you more than my whole self, but I have no more, and by myself I cannot render the whole of it to you. Draw me to you, Lord, in the fullness of your love. I am wholly yours by creation; make me all yours, too, in love.”

TUESDAY, MARCH 16, 2021

Use the simple drawings you created yesterday to represent a few of the words in Philippians 2:12-13 to continue to practice the memory work. Write out the verses and see how much you can do by memory.

The week’s memory work is **Galatians 6:7-9**:

Do not be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatever one sows, that will he also reap. For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life. And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up.

Planting the seeds of change requires us to press on with God as we wait for the seeds to take root and grow. Experience takes what we know at a cognitive level and lets it touch our thoughts, feelings, emotions, behaviors, and other areas of our life, and that takes time. In experience we are opening up to God’s influence and committing to Him in the journey. God will mold our attitudes, perspectives, behaviors, habits, values, and character as we open up to Him more and more, letting Him plant and water the seeds as we partner with Him in the journey.

How is experience different from a focused effort to fix a problem or change a habit?

Last week you started creating a plan for your next step in the journey. How did you design your plan to have fun and connect with God in the process?

It seems it would be easier if God would download the skills we need into our brain, but He sets His Spirit in our soul for experience with Him. Real change happens in relationship with God, but the tricky part is that we have to keep working and wait for the change to grow.

Philippians 3:12-14

Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

As you think about change in the journey, what obstacles stop you? Do you make excuses, focus on past failures, listen to discouraging voices, stay too busy, or possibly live emotionally exhausted?

God is calling us to be trees that bear fruit. Bearing fruit requires the self-discipline to stay focused on God and His work by His Holy Spirit.

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 17, 2021

The week’s memory work is **Philippians 2:12-13**, Recite the two verses as best as you can by memory.

There is a misperception in the North American Christian mindset that growth occurs when people of faith ignore their feelings. However, without intention to the underlying whys of thoughts, feelings, and behaviors, Christ-followers will continue to live from places of defeat. Emotions shape behavior, whether Christians want them to or not.

Change requires honesty and vulnerability. Experience requires us to admit what is going on inside of us. Experience entails being real about our brokenness, disappointments, and limitations. If we feel threatened by being open and honest with God, trusted mentors, and friends, we will stop the process of change.

As we are honest with God, He meets us where we are. He hears our prayers and helps us see how change is possible in Him. We walk with Him in love, asking Him how change will best occur in us. He knows us better than we know ourselves.

Why is vulnerability necessary in the experience of change?

When we take the step of vulnerability, we become more self-aware. Self-awareness is a crucial part of change. We identify our thoughts, feelings, and behaviors with God. We accurately articulate our place in the journey without condemnation and shame. Romans 8:1 says, “There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.”

Self-reflection with God helps us receive His grace, which is essential when applying God’s wisdom and spiritual truth to our life. John 1:14 “And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.”

Self-reflection with God also helps us look at ourselves with honesty. We experience the internal work of the Spirit, helping us understand our blind spots. We see with God’s eyes the places He is at work.

In the same respect, Jesus reminds us of the importance of focusing on the work He is about in our life rather than focusing on the change we believe needs to happen in others.

Luke 6:41-43

Why do you see the speck that is in your brother’s eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye? How can you say to your brother, ‘Brother, let me take out the speck that is in your eye,’ when you yourself do not see the log that is in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take out the speck that is in your brother’s eye.

How does self-reflection protect us from becoming prideful in the journey?

Spend some time in prayer and self-reflection with God.

Sometimes we believe change will not happen for us. We do not think we are strong enough or good enough to experience change. When this happens, we need to focus on God because change comes by His strength and goodness, not our own. For this reason, today, we are going to look at the names of God.

SATURDAY, MARCH 20, 2021

The week’s memory work is **Philippians 2:12-13**. Recite the two verses several times to ensure you have them memorized.

A new thought pattern, behavior, or another pathway for change is fun initially, but it may become a challenging routine during the experience part of the journey. For this reason, it is essential that the routine not be the central focus. Focus on Jesus and the fruit He is growing in you by His Spirit. There is a danger in us doing the activity completely in our strength and power. That is why Jesus said we could do nothing without Him.

John 15:5 *I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing.*

If you imagine a perfect life as we partner with Christ in His work in us and through us, please remember God’s ways are not our ways. We will experience good and bad times in life, but the key is staying connected with God in a relationship despite the ups, downs, twists, and turns of life.

In 2 Corinthians 12:5-10, the Apostle Paul shares, “On behalf of this man I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses— though if I should wish to boast, I would not be a fool, for I would be speaking the truth; but I refrain from it, so that no one may think more of me than he sees in me or hears from me. So to keep me from becoming conceited because of the surpassing greatness of the revelations, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to harass me, to keep me from becoming conceited. Three times I pleaded with the Lord about this, that it should leave me. But he said to me, ‘My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.’ Therefore, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me. For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. For when I am weak, then I am strong.”

At times in the journey, we will limp into experience. Rather than feeling empowered, we will expect failure. We may wonder why we are giving change another try, but this is

where God shows His strength. In His love and grace, our most significant places of failure can be the place in which He works through us the most. If we are willing to meet Jesus in all of the challenging areas of our life, God will work to bring redemption. As we give Him everything, God will reclaim the most trying times of the journey as we let Him heal us. God’s strength shines His glory in our weaknesses. If we hold onto God, let Him work, trust Him and persevere, we will experience Him in ways we never imagined.

Pray:

“Lord, I pray that You would teach me to yield myself to Your Spirit, Holy Spirit, teach me to trust You as a living person who leads my life and my prayers. Help me to understand your ministry and power. Help me to understand You as my Comforter, Counselor, Helper, Advocate, Intercessor, and Strengtheners. I long to see a demonstration of Your power in my life just as the Apostle Paul did (1 Corinthians 2:2-5). I thank You that You indwell, seal, sanctify, and empower me. You guide me, teach me, and pray through me. Help me to partner with You in everything I do. Transform my life completely with Your power. Make me sensitive to Your promptings, and teach me to partner with You in prayer in a deeper way.”





Write out the memory work using a separate notecard for each word. Shuffle the notecards and work to place the cards in the correct order. Keep the notecards and use them to practice the Scripture throughout the week.

Fruit-bearing in God’s kingdom often requires much work before we see significant results. Depth is the place in the journey where we begin to see God’s fruit.

Romans 6:21-23 *But what fruit were you getting at that time from the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things is death. But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the fruit you get leads to sanctification and its end, eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.*

In depth, we gradually begin thinking, feeling, and acting like Jesus. We begin living out our status as God’s children and our destiny in Him.

In C.S. Lewis’ essay “The Weight of Glory,” preached as a sermon in England in 1942 he writes:

Our Lord finds our desires not too strong, but too weak. We are half-hearted creatures, fooling about with drink and sex and ambition when infinite joy is offered us, like an ignorant child who wants to go on making mud pies in a slum because he cannot imagine what is meant by the offer of a holiday at the sea. We are far too easily pleased.

Depth calls us to move away from the places where we once found satisfaction, looking to experience God more and more. What might you be settling for instead of pursuing a relationship with God?

Pursuing God in the depth of a relationship with Him, and as we partner with Him, we will seek the Holy Spirit at work in us producing fruit. It is vital to remember that we should not attempt to produce righteousness through our efforts in depth. If we believe we will think, feel, and act like Jesus only by our actions, we will put energy toward trying harder rather than living in reliance on God's strength.

How have you experienced the Holy Spirit's power and guidance in your life to know and become like Jesus?

Be encouraged! This is depth!

TUESDAY, MARCH 23, 2021

The week’s memory work is **Philippians 3:13-14**. Yesterday you wrote out the memory work using a separate notecard for each word. Shuffle the notecards and practice putting the words in order.

What if I told you there are no ordinary people in this world? How would you respond?

Yesterday we discussed a quote from C.S. Lewis’ essay “The Weight of Glory.” Near the end of the same essay, Lewis writes:

It is a serious thing to live in a society of possible gods and goddesses, to remember that the dullest and most uninteresting person you can talk to may one day be a creature which, if you saw it now, you would be strongly tempted to worship, or else a horror and a corruption such as you now meet, if at all, only in a nightmare. All day long we are, in some degree, helping each other to one or other of these destinations. It is in the light of these overwhelming possibilities, it is with the awe and the circumspection proper to them, that we should conduct all our dealings with one another, all friendships, all loves, all play, all politics. There are no ordinary people. You have never talked to a mere mortal. Nations, cultures, arts, civilization—these are mortal, and their life is to ours as the life of a gnat. But it is immortals whom we joke with, work with, marry, snub, and exploit—immortal horrors or everlasting splendors. This does not mean that we are to be perpetually solemn. We must play. But our merriment must be of that kind (and it is, in fact, the merriest kind) which exists between people who have, from the outset, taken each other seriously—no flippancy, no superiority, no presumption. And our charity must be a real and costly love, with deep feeling for the sins in spite of which we love the sinner—no mere tolerance or indulgence which parodies love as flippancy parodies merriment. Next to the Blessed Sacrament itself, your neighbor is the holiest object presented to your senses. If he is your Christian neighbor he is holy in almost the same way, for in him also Christ vere latitat—the glorifier and the glorified, Glory Himself, is truly hidden.

A person growing deep in their relationship with God recognizes His image in themselves and every person they meet.

Not only do they desire to live their future in Christ, but they also want to lead others to the same. Because they see the significance of every person, they decide: “I will not hurt, exploit, use, degrade, or mock anyone. In heaven, this person is going to be awesome. I need to value the person in front of me because of who they are in God.”

Imagine the profound difference when we recognize the Glory of God hidden in every person. What would change in how we treat ourselves and others when we live this truth?

Sit quietly with God. Take a few deep breaths and settle into silence.

1. Close your eyes and offer these prayers several times, allowing God full access into your being.
2. **Pray:** “Father, Jesus, and Holy Spirit, please help me recognize You in me.”
3. **Pray:** “Father, Jesus, and Holy Spirit, please help me recognize You in others.”

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 24, 2021

The week's memory work is **Philippians 3:13-14**. Shuffle the notecards you made on Monday and practice putting the words in order.

Psalm 139:23-24 Search me, O God, and know my heart! Try me and know my thoughts! And see if there be any grievous way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting!

It takes courage to allow God to search us, but depth in Him requires that we ask. Let this prayer guide you into His Presence. "The Examen Prayer" is a tool to complete in the evening. It is a time to ask God openly and honestly if His truth is defining who you are as you contemplate your day with Him in love.

The Examen Prayer

Taken from The Examen Prayer - Timothy Gallagher

Introduction to the Examen

- Growth in relationship with God occurs through revelation.
- The Examen is a way of praying that opens our eyes to God's daily self-revelation and increasingly clarifies our own responses to it.
- The Examen is something we ask God to do. It is not human achievement.
- The Examen is our way of being regularly available to God so that His love can heal our darkness and point the way toward spiritual growth.
- The Examen prayer seeks the awareness of God's daily leading in our lives.
- The Examen is NOT the self-evaluation of a heart in isolation but rather a conversation and dialogue between our heart and God.

Transition

- Begin the Examen by becoming aware of God's love. See John 1:48, Mark 2:14, Luke 7:13, Mark 10:21.

Step One-Gratitude

- By starting with gratitude, we open the window into the deepest reality of our spiritual lives: God's unbounded love for us and desire for our response.

Step Two-Petition (Matthew 7:7 and John 14:13)

- Step one teaches us that all we do and have comes from God.
- Petition is asking for the grace that alone can make our Examen fruitful, recognizing that even the rest of this prayer of the Examen is a gift from God.

CONTINUED...

- Humbly and sincerely ask for the outpouring of God’s grace and love that enables us to do all things and so empowers us to practice the Examen.

Step Three-Review

- We review our spiritual experience of the day and ask God to shine light on our experience so that we may remember it well.
- When experiencing desolation (heaviness), ask God for the cause.
- When experiencing consolation (energizing joy), ask “what is the Lord desiring me to do?”
- This step contains enormous potential for growth in our capacity to notice, understand, and respond fruitfully to the spiritual movements of our hearts and to increase knowing God’s love.
- Watch for possible invitations from the Lord for moral growth.

Step Four-Forgiveness (Luke 15:20)

- This is the privileged daily space of the deep experience of knowing that we are loved and held by God in all our brokenness.
- In this step we reflect upon the times of our mistakes.
- Our asking for forgiveness is simply the gateway for God to respond with His loving embrace.

Step Five- Renewal

- The first four steps have looked back from the perspective of the present. This step looks ahead.
- In this step look ahead to foresee and plan specifically how to respond to God’s call to growth.
- Which spiritual initiatives will lead most surely to growth?
- What specifically shall we undertake as we prepare for the coming day?
- Will we be able to live concretely the newness that we seek?
- This step will often - though not always - be concerned with seemingly small initiatives. small enough that they would be unnoticed by others.

THURSDAY, MARCH 25, 2021

The week's memory work is **Philippians 3:13-14**. Shuffle the notecards you made on Monday and continue to practice putting the words in order.

Each time we go to the point of depth with God in our journey, we experience Him in a way that continues to change us over time. Depth is not a point of arrival. Depth is a place of growth. Take a moment to consider this statement. Is this a new concept to you as a Christ-follower? Why or why not?

Philippians 2:1-11: *So if there is any encouragement in Christ, any comfort from love, any participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy, complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore, God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.*

In book 3 of *Mere Christianity* in chapter 8, titled "The Great Sin," C.S. Lewis writes:

Pride gets no pleasure out of having something, only out of having more of it than the next man. We say that people are proud of being rich, or clever, or good-looking, but they are not. They are proud of being richer, or cleverer, or better-looking than others. If everyone else became

equally rich, or clever, or good-looking there would be nothing to be proud about. It is the comparison that makes you proud: the pleasure of being above the rest. Once the element of competition has gone, pride has gone. . . .

Whenever we find that our religious life is making us feel that we are good—above all, that we are better than someone else—I think we may be sure that we are being acted on, not by God, but by the devil. . . .

Teachers, in fact, often appeal to a boy’s Pride, or as they call it, his self-respect, to make him behave decently: many a man has overcome cowardice, or lust, or ill-temper by learning to think they are beneath his dignity—that is, by Pride. The devil laughs. He is perfectly content to see you becoming chaste and brave and self-controlled provided, all the time, he is setting up in you the Dictatorship of Pride—just as he would be quite content to see your chilblains cured if he was allowed, in return, to give you cancer. For Pride is spiritual cancer: it eats up the very possibility of love, or contentment, or even common sense.

Anytime we love and admire anything more than we love and admire God, we are taking the wrong path. We can even love and admire our growth in God in such a way it becomes prideful. God wants us to know Him. He wants us to give Him ourselves. If we are growing, we will be authentic over arrogant. Arrogance invites others to look at us. Authenticity invites others to see the work God is doing in us.

How do we protect ourselves from pride as we come alongside others in depth? Spend time in prayer.

FRIDAY, MARCH 26, 2021

The week’s memory work is **Philippians 3:13-14**. Shuffle the notecards you made on Monday and continue to practice putting the words in order.

Depth begins a process in which we invest in others. In Luke 22, Jesus takes the opportunity raised by the disciple’s discord to teach about true greatness.

Luke 22:24-27: *A dispute also arose among them, as to which of them was to be regarded as the greatest. And he said to them, “The kings of the Gentiles exercise lordship over them, and those in authority over them are called benefactors. But not so with you. Rather, let the greatest among you become as the youngest, and the leader as one who serves. For who is the greater, one who reclines at table or one who serves? Is it not the one who reclines at table? But I am among you as the one who serves.*

Depth is the place in the journey in which we recognize true greatness—a greater love for others. We genuinely care about people and their well-being.

In depth, we are not responsible for a person’s needs. Instead, we are responsible for being obedient to God’s leading. In love and humility, we listen to God and do what we feel He is calling us to do. This might look like picking up the phone to call someone when the Holy Spirit prompts us. It could be we feel compelled to bring groceries, a card, or something of this nature to someone. Maybe we feel God calling us to give our time: cleaning someone’s home, fixing someone’s vehicle, shoveling their snow, mowing their lawn, raking their leaves, giving financially, or praying for them as He leads.

Have you experienced a time of Serve in such a way?
What happened?

Perhaps you have been on the receiving end of someone’s service. How did another person bless you by following God’s leading?

Galatians 5:13-14 *For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: “You shall love your neighbor as yourself.*

How is Serve a place in which we love our neighbor as ourselves? How might God be calling you to serve someone this week?

Pray

“Lord, I pray that You would teach me to yield myself to Your Spirit. Holy Spirit, teach me to trust You as a living person who leads my life and my prayers. Help me to understand your ministry and power. Help me to understand You as my Comforter, Counselor, Helper, Advocate, Intercessor, and Strengtheners. I long to see a demonstration of Your power in my life just as the Apostle Paul did (1 Corinthians 2:2-5). I thank You that You indwell, seal, sanctify, and empower me. You guide me, teach me, and pray through me. Help me to partner with You in everything I do. Transform my life completely with Your power. Make me sensitive to Your promptings and teach me to partner with You in prayer in a deeper way.”

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

God designed our lives as followers of Jesus to happen in community. For this reason, the strategy of spiritual growth must include this essential component. In a crisis, it's easy to revert to old patterns. Caring for your well-being during the coronavirus pandemic includes maintaining healthy boundaries and saying no to unhealthy relationships. Is someone else's problem your problem? If, like so many others, you've lost sight of your own life in the drama of tending to someone else's, you may be codependent.

Boundaries: by Dr. Henry Cloud and Dr. John Townsend

Having clear boundaries is essential to a healthy, balanced lifestyle. A boundary is a personal property line that marks those things for which we are responsible. In other words, boundaries define who we are and who we are not. Boundaries impact all areas of our lives: Physical boundaries help us determine who may touch us and under what circumstances -- Mental boundaries give us the freedom to have our own thoughts and opinions -- Emotional boundaries help us to deal with our own emotions and disengage from the harmful, manipulative emotions of others -- Spiritual boundaries help us to distinguish God's will from our own and give us renewed awe for our Creator.



HOLY WEEK REFLECTION

Galatians 2:20 I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.

You may be asking yourself, "What do I do now?" Here's a few ideas:

1. Celebrate what God has done and is doing in your life. Celebrate with Him how you gave something up to create more space and time for Him during Lent. Journal about what you learned and what you want to continue learning going forward.
2. If you haven't yet, create a plan to continue to grow in Christ. Taking steps to know and become like Jesus does not happen without intentionality. We must participate with focus and determination because Christ is central to all change.
3. If you are not in a small group, find community for support on the journey.

Remember, the journey is cyclical. We will continue to journey through these processes through life as we grow to know and become like Jesus. Jesus is our companion walking with us on the journey. We have to trust Him as our guide. He loves us. He knows what is going on inside of us. When we realize we are walking with Him, we begin to let go of the burden of figuring everything out on our own. God knows the right pace and our best next step in the journey. God is not meant to be the place we turn only when things are hard. God is our life, and this is what it means to be a follower of Jesus Christ.

CONTINUED...

Because change in Him is a process, we can feel frustrated when things don't look as we expect them to. Understanding we can try softer rather than harder and try different because God is at work gives us the courage to keep moving forward to knowing and becoming like Jesus. We ask God for what we want, but we come back to the truth that He loves us and will give us what we need. In love, God's priority is to help us know Him more and grow us more and more into His Son's character.

What is God stirring in you through Renewal? As we end this time together, ask yourself:

1. Where am I on my spiritual journey?
2. What is my next step?

Colossians 1:9-13 I am asking you, Lord, that I may be filled with the knowledge of Your will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding, so that I may walk worthy of You, Lord, fully pleasing to You: bearing fruit in every good work and growing in the knowledge of God, being

strengthened with all power, according to Your glorious might, so that I may have great endurance and patience, joyfully giving thanks to You, my Father, who has enabled me to share in the saints of inheritance in the light. You have rescued me from the domain of darkness and transferred me into the Kingdom of Your Son, whom You love.
